Course Description:

In this course the emphasis is on giving students the opportunity to be exposed to various reading material as well as being capable of analyzing various texts. Students will practice writing- and speaking skills and how to organize their argument in a clear and decisive manner. This course focuses on specified vocabulary i.e. students choose the vocabulary in connection with their studies and interests. Furthermore, a special focus is on the use of different mediums and variable source material. Independent task- based learning is a crucial element in the course.

Precursor courses: 15 units on level 2 or ENSK2OL05 and ENSK2OR05

Learning goals

This course focuses on working with academic texts of all kinds. The assignments are connected to the main subject areas or lines that each student is working on in their studies. Furthermore, reading, writing, listening, and speaking will be practiced in various assignments throughout the term. These include group work, pair work and individual work. Students should be able to organize their studies, enhance their vocabulary and read complex texts in context for use in their further studies.

Students must organize their work in a personal folder which they are required to hand in at the end of term as part of the final grade.

- Feature films will be worked on in class in written assignments and group discussion, followed by an oral exam. Students will work with writing in relation to different types of academic texts and lectures.
- There are two larger assignments that focus on the academic/specific vocabulary connected to the students own personal studies/lines.
- A second oral exam will be conducted at the end of term, in which the students will present their knowledge on their personal vocabulary.

Knowledge

Students should have acquired knowledge and understanding on the following:

- Vocabulary that allows the student to use to his/her advantage in reading for their further studies or workplace.
- Traditions related to using different speaking and writing styles for different purposes.

Skills

Students should have acquired certain skill sets in the following:

- Understand thoroughly specialized texts.
- Reading complicated texts, for pleasure or information.
- Using speaking skills efficiently in different circumstances.
- Using writing for different purposes, academic and personal, using appropriate writing styles.

Competence

Students should be able to use the knowledge and skills they have acquired to:

- Use in lecture, debates and communication about subjects they are knowledgeable about.
- Understand and absorb for further use complicated, academic or technical material.
- To analyze and be critical of texts.
- Use academic texts to their advantage and evaluate sources critically.
- Explain thoroughly complicated items and processes about their specified field.
- Be able to find and cite sources in an academic manner.

You MUST hand in ALL assignments to finish this course. There is no final exam at the end of the term so the final grade in the course is based on a continuous evaluation of the term assignments. Students are reminded that material on the Internet as well as in other media is copyright by law. If a student is found to have committed plagiarism, the assignment is considered null and void. Resubmission will not be allowed in this case.

The term assignments will unfold and be worked on in class and online, therefore it is important that students attend classes online and in person. **If a student is not able to attend, he or she must notify the teacher and make a contract about their coursework.** Also, if a student has some learning disability, he or she should talk to the teacher as soon as possible.
