## **Áfangalýsing:**

The aim of the course is to introduce to students the world of drama, to increase vocabulary, to further students' skills in writing and speaking English, as well as increasing overall competence in the English language.

In the end of the course students should be able to listen to and read material about drama. They should be able to take part in discussions about theatre and drama, as well as writing papers on drama related subjects.

## **Learning goals:**

- to introduce the history and development of dramatic texts from ancient Greece to Modern English.
- To provide students with the opportunity to acquaint themselves better with English literature and to enjoy reading a choice selection of literary texts from various periods.
- In connection with the reading students will also acquaint themselves with literary terms.
- To make students more fluent in understanding, reading and writing English.

William Shakespeare: Romeo and Juliet – available online

A selected play from library

Photocopied material from teacher available at school bookshop

A trip to see a play in Reykjavík

#### **Schedule:**

### **Special rules for this course:**

Reading and preparing at home is crucial for this course. It is imperative that students take part in discussion in class and come prepared to class, show initiative and enthusiasm, work independently at home as well as in class, cooperate in group work and keep track of events via Moodle on a regular basis.
