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# **Course description:**

- To review and examine the basics of English through writing, listening, reading, and speaking.
- To prepare students and build a foundation for further studies in English.
- To teach students to organize their studies with systematic working methods.

### **Knowledge Criteria:**

Students should know and understand:

- The vocabulary necessary to meet the proficiency criteria of the level
- The fundamental elements of the language system
- The structure and composition of texts and the difference between spoken and written language

#### **Skills Criteria:**

Students should have acquired the skills to:

- Understand spoken language on familiar topics when spoken clearly and audibly
- Read various texts in their area of interest or on familiar topics
- Participate in general conversations on topics they know or are interested in
- Write coherent texts on topics they know or are interested in and use appropriate language
- Follow the basic rules that apply to written language
- Use information technology and aids in their language learning

### **Competence Criteria:**

Students should be able to apply the knowledge and skills they have acquired to:

- Follow narratives and presentations and grasp the main points from multimedia if the content is familiar
- Grasp the main points in short magazine or newspaper articles and draw conclusions from what they read
- Read literature for pleasure and development at an appropriate level of difficulty and express their opinion on it
- Convey their own knowledge, opinions, and feelings as well as personal experiences, hopes, and expectations

- Write about events, both imagined and real
- Write summaries based on specific content, such as a movie or newspaper article, and write about their interests and hobbies
